
Civil War Round Table of St. Charles-July 2025 Newsletter

In July, we welcome back local author and historian Jim Erwin, who will speak about the Missouri State Militia. The Missouri State Militia (MSM) was a federally funded state militia organization in Missouri, conceived in 1861 and beginning service in 1862. It was a full-time force primarily tasked with conducting offensive operations against Confederate guerrillas and recruiters, as well as opposing raids by regular Confederate forces. The MSM was not intended to operate outside Missouri. However, there were several instances during the war when units found themselves operating beyond the state, including playing a significant role in Price's 1864 Missouri Expedition. At one point, the MSM numbered more than 13,000 soldiers, but this force was reduced to 10,000 soldiers by the United States government. Hopefully, Jim will bring along some of his books to sell.



In August, Layne Chartrand will give a presentation about the common soldier in the Civil War. Layne is a former reenactor, and hopefully, he will have a few teaching aids to accompany his presentation. Our members asked Layne to speak again this year after his fascinating talk about the Confederate Navy last year.

Our next tour will be a battlefield tour of Wilson's Creek on the weekend of October 18-19. Sergeant First Class (retired) Kent Fujiwara will give a presentation on Wilson's Creek in October and will be the lead guide during the tour.
